CIDD Double Degree Scholarships 2021

Application deadline April 30

CIDD Double Degree Scholarships for 2021

Each year the CIDD offers Double Degree Scholarships. This year the CIDD welcomes applications from students that are participating or have completed a double-degree programme during the 2020-2021 academic year taking into account that either the home or receiving institution must be a member of the CIDD. The applicant may be in any field and at any level. The amount for 1st place is 1000 €, 2nd place is 750 € and 3rd, 4th and 5th place are 500 € each.

The deadline for the application is April 30 and the final decision will be announced in June during the CIDD General Assembly.

The needed documents may be found in the CIDD website: cidd.org. The requirements for applying are to send the following to the CIDD Assistant email: ciddassistant@gmail.com.

- Filled out application
- Letter of motivation in English - 500 words maximum - indicating why you should be considered for this scholarship and what you gained from completing a double degree.
- Letter of recommendation in English from either the home university or the receiving university confirming that the student is enrolled and has a good GPA (Grade Point Average) – no need to provide a transcript.
- Link to a 3-minute Youtube video testimonial in English about your current experience doing a double degree. The applicant should explain how they benefited from the double degrees. Videos should be clear and engaging. The video will be presented in the CIDD Youtube channel.

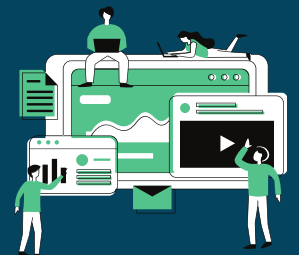
How universities adjusted to the pandemic

The COVID-19 pandemic caused many disruptions for universities around the world, especially to their global initiatives. The spread of the coronavirus caused multiple border closures and travel restrictions as every country did what it thought was necessary to contain the pandemic. Many students on exchange and long-term programs abroad had to return to their home country. Dr. Darla Domke-Damonte, Associate Provost for Global Initiatives at Coastal Carolina University, explained that the main priority when the pandemic broke was to “recall students who were abroad, working with those partner institutions to assure academic continuity.

While most international students left Coastal Carolina University to return home in the spring of 2020, there was a need to identify how these students will continue their education in the fall of 2020. Some students chose to return to campus in the fall. Others were either unable to travel or chose not to. Dr. Domke-Damonte’s office worked with students from abroad to make sure that they had an academic plan and that they were compliant with US immigration regulations. Fortunately, while Coastal Carolina University offered some in-person classes in the fall, all the classes were also streaming online, allowing students to stream them from anywhere in the world. Responding to the pandemic compelled universities to be flexible and rely on online education. It is likely, that universities will continue to provide a lot of online education after the pandemic. Teaching online allows universities to have a more global reach.

Responding to COVID-19: lessons learned from creating a collaborative Massive Open Online Course on entrepreneurship

Indisputably, digitalizing courses built for contact teaching at such a fast pace has not come without difficulties. From the learner’s point of view, the change has evoked a genuine need for more interaction. We at Haaga-Helia, Finland, wanted to provide a few ideas on how we can increase interaction in online learning and how technology can support in doing so by reflecting on lessons we learned from creating and implementing a Massive Open Online Course (MOOC) on entrepreneurship, “the Co-Innovation Journey for Startups and Corporates”, during spring 2020 for over 2,400 enrolled learners.

A new double degree agreement between CIDD members

The University of Applied Sciences Wuerzburg-Schweinfurt (FHWS) and the Faculty of Business Management, University of Economics in Bratislava, both members of the Consortium of International Double Degrees (CIDD), have set up a double degree programme in 2021. Jana Blštáková, vice-dean for international relations at the University of Economics in Bratislava has provided as with some key insights about this new collaboration.

What is the structure of the programme?

Students participating in the Double Degree Programme are required to study for at least two semesters (or equivalent time) at the partner institution and earn a minimum of 60 ECTS (or an equivalent number) credits.

What programmes are offered in the double degree?

The double degree is set up between the Bachelor Degree Program Business Economics and Management of University of Economics in Bratislava, Faculty of Business Management and the Bachelor Degree Programme in International Management and the Bachelor Degree Programme in Betriebswirtschaft respectively of FHWS.

What are the top benefits your university gets from the double degree cooperation? Why do you want to cooperate?

There is wider portfolio of options for internationalization of education for our students. We have always been regionally and historically connected countries. Many students are interested into studies in Germany.

What are the top benefits for students completing this double degree?

Differentiation in the labour market. Building quality networks. And eventually decrees of radicalism and opening minds for tolerance and appreciation of diversity.
